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### SHORT BIOGRAPHY

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Kei Nakajima is an associate professor of public international law at the University of Tokyo, the Institute of Social Science. He is formerly an associate legal officer at the International Court of Justice in The Hague. He received an LL.M. and Ph.D. from the University of Tokyo for his study on evidence and fact-finding before international courts and tribunals and a second Ph.D. from the Graduate Institute of International and Development Studies in Geneva for his work on the international law of sovereign debt dispute settlement. He regularly advises Japan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs on international dispute settlement.
